"We strive to maintain as much independence for our residents as possible," said Bradley. "For those that are unable to dress themselves, we encourage them to choose their own clothing, allowing them to make these choices helps maintain their independence while slowing the decline in cognitive function."

Supporting the families is also important, noted Bradley. "Family support often involves simply being there to talk... being supportive, having conversations, and helping them understand the progression of the disease is crucial."

"It's just a nice place. If anything happens, they call immediately. Any time anything changes, I get a phone call," explained Smith. "They just go above and beyond. I can't say enough..."

### Passavant Community: Embracing Montessori Philosophy

At Passavant Community, memory support through the lens of the Montessori philosophy fosters an environment where residents are empowered to engage with their surroundings in meaningful ways.
